

#### FOREWORD

#### Psalm 23.6a: Goodness and love unfailing will follow me all the days of my life ...

As we embark on a new year of prayer, we appreciate as never before the Diocesan Cycle of Prayer itself. It is a rich invitation to belong to God, to one another, to those whom we know and to those whom we do not know. It invites us to do all of this in a way that is all the more strengthening because it is invisible. God, as we know, is unseen yet ever near. This is the gift of grace that God affords to people of faith. It is the gift for us to receive and to give and to share, to open up and to offer to others as a bounty given generously by God to us and to those for whom we pray. Prayer has become not only the backdrop but also the backbone of our daily life as we have lived through a succession of Lockdowns and as we have grappled with anxiety and fear for others as for ourselves throughout 2021. We also pray in celebration of God's goodness to us. As we emerge from the Restrictions with which we have complied carefully and consistently, we would do well to remember that the coronavirus is not behind us as something that does not have a lasting impact and an ingenious capacity to develop its own deadly variants and to take whole continents by surprize. What is asked of us now is to show personal responsibility as we continue to live our lives as we move from a particular type of darkness into the light of new life. We have in some ways more opportunities for prayer than ever before as a new horizon beckons. The Diocesan Cycle of Prayer enables us to use these opportunities daily at home and weekly in church. We have the confidence that other people and parishes are praying for us and for our parish as we are praying for them. And, as we do this, we remember with gratitude the communities within which our parishes are set and the communities to whom they belong. Old needs and fresh needs come to the surface and God is always present to answer our prayer and the prayer of other people.

The Diocesan Cycle of Prayer has also kept us in close touch with members of our companion diocese of Jerusalem and the Middle East. Every part of the world is in the grip of the coronavirus. Each part of the world is touched and singed by it. To know that we have the prayers and the blessing of those who are close every day to the locations that we associate from childhood with the Bible and with Biblical life now as then is a great comfort to us. We pray for the new archbishop of The Diocese of Jerusalem and The Middle East, Archbishop Hosam Naoum, his clergy and his people in their daily life and witness and in their many hardships and trials.

Last year I said this in the Foreword: 2021 may be similar to 2020, or it may be significantly different. I also said: Prayer is for us an anchor in the uncharted waters of faith, hope and love. Whatever our individual experience, prayer gives us a stability and a place and a time for reflection and revitalization. We are yet to discover what 2022 will bring. We do know that it will bring the need for sustained and deepened prayer. I should like to thank The Editor, the Reverend Canon Mark Gardner for all of his careful work in putting together this Cycle of Prayer. I hope that you use this excellent volume as do I throughout the year every year.
